

The Electronic Travel Authorization System (K-ETA) is a system in which citizens of countries that can enter the Republic of Korea without a visa submit travel information and obtain permission before entering the Republic of Korea when visiting the Republic of Korea.

**K-ETA will be temporarily exempted for 22 countries and regions:**
